### **Hampden County Sheriff's Office Promotes 24 Correctional Officers to Corporal**

**LUDLOW**— The Hampden County Sheriff's Office proudly announces the promotion of 24 correctional officers to the rank of Corporal, recognizing their commitment to excellence, leadership, and service to the community.

Sheriff Nick Cocchi led the promotion ceremony and applauded the officers for their professionalism and dedication.

"Today we recognize more than a promotion – we celebrate the unwavering commitment these men and women have shown to their peers, to our department, and to the people we serve," said Sheriff Cocchi. "These individuals have proven themselves to be leaders, mentors, and trusted professionals who will help us carry out our mission of supporting public safety while offering a pathway to rehabilitation for those in our custody."

The officers were promoted following a competitive and thorough selection process that included a written examination, a review of their service records, and supervisory evaluations. The new Corporals will take on expanded responsibilities, including serving as frontline leaders within their housing units and work details, guiding new officers, and reinforcing the standards and expectations of the department.

The Hampden County Sheriff's Office remains a national model of modern corrections and community engagement, with a strong focus on rehabilitation, reentry, and prevention. Under Sheriff Cocchi's leadership, the department has prioritized evidence-based programs, mental health and substance use treatment, education and vocational training, and support for justice-involved individuals both during and after incarceration.

"Our mission is simple but powerful: to protect our communities while giving people the tools to make better decisions and live better lives," said Sheriff Cocchi. "Promoting leaders from within helps ensure that our facilities operate with professionalism, empathy, and structure – and that we remain focused on breaking the cycles of crime and addiction."

The promotion ceremony was held on the Ludlow campus of the Hampden County Correctional Center and was attended by family members, colleagues, and department leadership.
